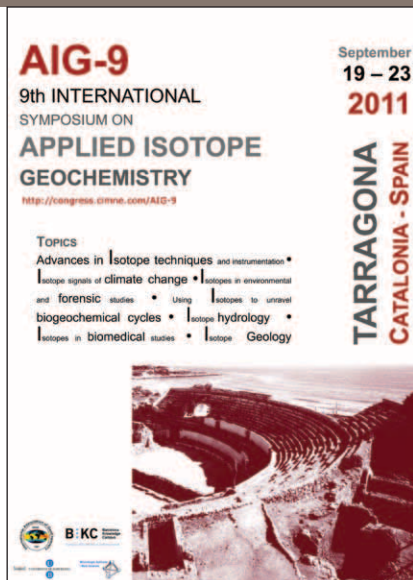

Isotope specialists from around the world are invited to meet in Catalonia, Tarragona Province, Spain, for the **9th International Symposium on Applied Isotope Geochemistry (AIG-9)**, which will be held on **19–23 September 2011**. The venue for the meeting will be the city of Tarragona, located on the Mediterranean in the heart of the Costa Daurada and less than 100 km away from Barcelona. Tarragona has many monuments surviving from the ancient Roman era, including the Tarraco archaeological complex, a UNESCO World Heritage Site.

Following the format of previous AIG meetings, the organizers (Dr. Albert Soler and his team from the University of Barcelona) are planning to have the accommodations, conference sessions, and breakfast and lunch in the same venue, the Hotel Imperial Tarraco, and to hold a mid-conference field trip. GES-9 continues the triennial series begun 25 years ago by the IAGC Working Group on the Geochemistry of the Earth's Surface. These symposia cover the geochemistry of rock, water, air and life on the surface of the Earth, in both natural and perturbed systems. The 2011 meeting, on the theme "Geochemical Landscapes in the Anthropocene," will highlight human participation, both passive and active, in geochemical systems. The meeting will also serve as a gathering point for researchers interested in critical zone science.
