The EAG invites nominations for the Urey Award, the Houtermans Award, the Science Innovation Award and the GS/EAG Geochemical Fellows Award. Your nomination is crucial to ensure recognition of deserving scientists, so please consider nominating for these awards. The **Urey Award** recognizes outstanding contributions advancing geochemistry over a career.

The **Houtermans Award** is given to a scientist no more than 35 years old or within 6 years of the PhD for a single exceptional contribution to geochemistry, published as a single paper or a series of papers on a single topic.

The **Science Innovation Award** subject area differs every year according to a five-year cycle, and in 2013 the award will be named in honour of Nicholas Shackleton for his work on climatology. This award is conferred for important and innovative breakthroughs in geochemistry, and the recipient must be between 35 and 55 years old.

The **GS/EAG Geochemical Fellows Award** is bestowed upon outstanding scientists who have made major contributions to the field of geochemistry.

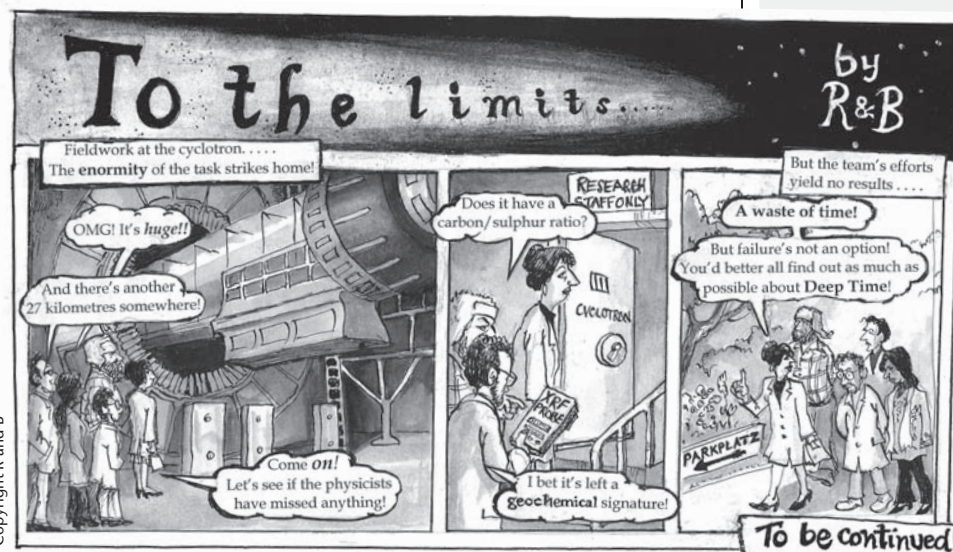
