H.C. Urey Award to Bo Barker Jørgensen



The recipient of the 2023 H.C. Urey Award is Bo Barker Jørgensen from Aarhus University, Denmark. Bo Barker Jørgensen is a world-renowned microbial ecologist whose impact on biogeochemistry and geobiology has been revolutionary. Through novel methodologies and careful experiments and observations, Bo has revealed how microbes inhabiting marine waters and sediments both respond to and control their chemical environment. Thus, Bo

has shown us how microbes shape the chemistry of the environment.

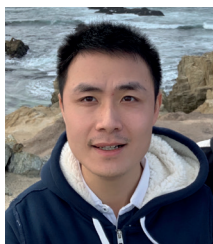
N. Shackleton Science Innovation Award to Rosalind Rickaby



The recipient of the 2023 Science Innovation Award is Rosalind Rickaby from University of Oxford, United Kingdom. Rosalind Rickaby is a world leader in developing novel proxies from marine carbonates to reconstruct climate and, more generally, Earth's environment over geological time. Indeed, her research has informed us about the co-evolution of the geosphere and biosphere. The 2023 Science Innovation Award is named in honor of Nicholas

Shackleton for his work in climatology.

F.G. Houtermans Award to Ming Tang



The recipient of the 2023 F.G. Houtermans Award is Ming Tang from Peking University, China. Ming Tang is recognized for forging new paths, thinking in new ways about old problems, and having a significant impact on our understanding of Earth, particularly the evolution of continental crust. He is also a kind-hearted and patient mentor who inspires those around him.
